

Play your part to help Blarney come first in litter challenge this year

Cork County Council officially launched the Anti-Litter Challenge competition 2012 on Monday May 14th. The objectives of the competition are to reduce litter pollution in the county as a whole, and to encourage community involvement in the solutions to litter pollution. Similar to last year, the competition will be run over a 6 week period; 21st May to 30th May, 4th June to 13th June, and 18th June to 27th June.

The following change has been made to the Competition for this year; one cigarette butts will count as 0.1 piece of litter, therefore ten cigarette butts equal one piece of litter. In contrast to previous years where a mark was lost for each 1-10 pieces of litter, every piece of litter will count as a lost mark, and results will be out of 1000 instead of 100. This is to address an anomaly that existed last year, where one cigarette butt would cost the same as 99 cigarette butts.

The judging period has changed from a fortnightly period to a 10 day period with a 4 day break in between judging to allow Communities to evaluate judging results and to clean up areas of





Times Past...

larney, that most interesting centre of Irish romance, with its magnificent groves and lake and castle and Stone, unquestionably possesses associations of the profoundest character associations which for countless generations have afforded themes to the poet, the artist, and the descriptive writer, and which even today command the notice of rich and poor, peer and peasant, the most erudite, as well as he who is susceptible to the influence of superstition and romanticism. But the sylvan glories of Blarney's charming groves and the romance of its castle, Stone, and lake would have little or no claim to recognition in these historical annals of Industrial Hibernia had they not been in juxtaposition to a mighty factor in Irish commerce which, in its own unpretentious way, is teaching to Irishmen the magnificent lesson that "capital" can find – in capable hands - a profitable employment within the sea walls of the "Emerald Isle," and that "labour need not seek and advantageous market on foreign shores and among alien peoples, while industrial activities at home claim the enriching services of the artisan and labourer." This line of thought was strongly suggested to us on the occasion of a recent visit of inspection to the magnificent woollen manufacturing mills of Messrs. Martin Mahony and Brothers, of Blarney, a firm whose influence has been a thousand times more beneficial to the district in particular, and the kingdom at large, than the entire accumulation of romance and beauty with which the name of the locality is associated. The firm of Messrs. Martin Mahony and Brothers is of consider4able antiquity. It dates back to the year 1751, since which date, in an unbroken sequence, the concern has passed down from father to son to the present day. Not that Messrs. Mahony's mills were always located at Blarney. They were originally founded at Rochestown, and were from that place transferred to Blackpool, thence to Glanmire, and, in 1824, to Blarney. By an unfortunate accident the Blarney Mills were, in the year 1869, totally destroyed by fire. But, phoenix-like, they speedily arose once more from amid the ashes, a grander, more substantial, and more thoroughly equipped establishment than before. We are assured that, to rebuild the factory, and to fit up all the new and expensive machinery, were gigantic under-takings; nevertheless they were carried out with conspicuous success. In 1862 the manufacture of tweeds was enterprised by the firm, and the high and world-wide reputation which the firm has earned is a sufficient testimonial to the value and excellence of the goods

manufactured. The Blarney tweeds are unsurpassed by the choicest productions of the Western Highlands of Scotland, ands they find equal acceptance in the leading markets of the world, including London, Paris, and New York.

A peculiar feature of the Blarney Mills is the complete character of its manufacturing operations. In the great woollen districts of Yorkshire it is almost, if not quite, impossible to find a firm that manufactures the cloth, through all its varied stages, from the raw wool as imported to the finished tweed as sold to the tailor and merchant.. But that is just what Messrs. Mahony and Brothers most successfully accomplish. The wool is received from the home and colonial markets, three large machines are employed in washing it, two large steamheated machines dry it, twelve sets of carding machines comb it, twenty-six "mules" - that is to say, nine thousand spindles - convert the wool into yarn, nineteen twisting frames twist the various colours of varn, and two hundred looms weave the variegated threads or yarn into the elegant fabrics which subsequently grace the window of the fashionable sartorial establishments in New Bond Street (London) or Broadway (New York). The weaving shed alone covers half an acre, a small portion, however, of the entire space occupied by the firm. In continuation of the weaving shed is a large wing known as "Aberdeen Shed", it having been opened when Lord and Lady Aberdeen paid the factory a visit during the Vice-Royalty of the former. Here the picking and darning is done. Here also the tweeds are dried in a machine capable of holding 250 yards of cloth at a time, and are put through the four finishing machines and pressed by hydraulic machinery.

Had space permitted, it would have been interesting to offer a detailed account of the processes of dyeing, cleaning, and other essential operations; it must suffice, however, to state that every section of the factory is equipped with a view to the most perfect results, and the vast organisation moves in a methodical style that even clockwork cannot excel. The firm employs about 750 hands (male and female), and about £20,000 per annum is disbursed by the Messrs. Mahony and Brothers in wages

alone

The factory is surrounded by the neat homes of the workers, and, for the comfort and convenience of the latter, a dining-hall, a reading-room, and a school have been provided by the generous bounty and consideration of the firm. The workers, too, have established a co-operative stores, in their midst, the very successful operations of which abundantly demonstrate the intelligence and administrative capacity of the Irish working man. Of the splendid warehouse and offices, situate at No. 3 Camden Quay, Cork, little need be said; they are in every respect thoroughly adapted to the requirements of the business, and themselves constitute an important and valuable addition to the commerce and industry of Cork City. The showrooms are noble, their space exceptional, and their arrangement remarkable for completeness even in such headquarters of order, system, and organization. The stock is large and comprehensive and embraces the best examples of the firm's manufacture. The foregoing enumeration, brief as it obviously and necessarily is, and quite inadequate as a resume of one of the largest manufactories in this portion of the British Empire, may nevertheless convey some slight indication of the magnitude and thoroughly representative character of the operations of the firm, whose market extends over the entire face of the civilized world. The directorate of this private firm at the present time is composed of Micholas Mahony, Esq., Timothy Mahony Esq., and Edmond Roynane Mahony Esq. In public and private life, and both as manufacturers and Irish citizens, these gentlemen have earned by their deeds the respect of their fellow countrymen.

The status of the house of Messrs. Martin Mahony and Brothers offers Ireland's most striking illustration of the good fruit borne by native enterprise and business capacity that can and ought to flourish as well in Erin's mercantile system as in the systems of neighbouring nations; and the substantial success achieved by the firm is creditable alike to the honourable spirit governing its operations and to the great arm of the national commerce in which it is unquestionably a most potent and influential factor.

WALKING TRAILS SET TO PUT BALLINCOLLIG ON THE TOURIST MAP

THE National Trails Office has approved four new walking trails in Ballincollig which could be the first step in making the town a key tourist destination.

The trails are being developed by Ballincollig Trails Group which comprises representatives from Cork Orienteering Club, Ballincollig Business Association, Ballincollig Tidy Towns, Ballincollig Heritage Association, Ballincollig Community Forum and Café Chico.

The core route is a 7km loop starting in the town centre, continuing westwards before passing through the regional park and returning via the powdermills. This trail will be supplemented by three shorter trails of varying lengths within the regional park, all clearly marked and colour-coded for easy interpretation. A permanent orienteering course is also due to be put in place this year.

Cork County Council Parks & Amenities section, which put exercise equipment into the park last year, is fully behind this initiative and the trails group is liaising closely with its officers in order to put in the most eco-friendly signage appropriate to a natural setting.

Information maps will be erected in the town and in the park so that locals and visitors alike can discover the many different walking routes available. It is hoped that further signage will follow, highlighting the military history of Ballincollig and its gunpowder mills, giving information about the biodiversity of the park combined with a notice board allowing any event in the park to be adverticed.

South East Cork Area Development (SECAD), which has assisted greatly in the planning of the routes, will be providing part of the funding required for signage, trail improvement and interpretative signs. The other part of the funding has to be provided by the community so the trails group will be running a series of fund-raising events in the coming months to progress the trails as quickly as possible.

Blarney Community Spirit shines through for Weekend challenge



ast weekend Blarney was transformed from sleepy village to hive of industry when RTE came to film a Weekend Challenge. The selection process was an onerous one, initially Blarney was one of 70 possible choices, before being whittled down to 10, then to 4 and then finally getting the nod.

At 8am on Saturday April 21st hundreds of people gathered at the gates of the Church of the Resurrection, Blarney, to begin the task and meet the RTE crew and presenter, Colm Hayes. The church became the main hub for the weekend and painting the exterior and tidying up the churchyard was a major operation of the project.

This followed just over one week of meetings and planning involving local community groups, among them, Blarney Chamber of Commerce, Tom MacGrath who heads the wonderful Blarney Tidy Towns and Blarney Community Council. Many groups played their part in making the weekend such a success and it was tireless work to coordinate the project with several radio appeals being made for sponsors and volunteers. The County Council did trojan work with grass cutting and made sure that the village looked sparkling, as did the Fas and Avondhu Blackwater guys who were hard at work from the word go. The village looked so well, we suspected that TV coverage might be cancelled as there was nothing to improve upon!

Sponsors were generous beyond belief; the paint was provided by Pat McDonnell Paints, scaffolding came from Maguires, cherry-pickers and paint sprayers came from Dan Lane Rylane; the list was endless (see page 21). Prior to the weekend, grass and ivy had been cleared away from the walls of the church, the scaffolding had been put up, a plaque with the name of the church had been erected, plans and schedules had been created, volunteers had been signed up and assigned roles. Many people from outside Blarney came to offer help for the challenge including Grenagh Tidy Towns. We do not know all of you personally, but we appreciate greatly all your efforts. Denis Murphy designed a memorial garden inside the entrance to the graveyard which commemorates all those buried in the graveyard in unnamed graves. The garden features a wooden bench and an innovative grass couch amid a blaze of planting and nesting boxes; a beautiful spot to sit and meditate on a sunny morning with a cup of coffee. Blarney Castle sent the services of their expert gardeners and marked the occasion by giving a beautiful yew tree for the graveyard.

In many areas around the village such as Inchancomain Park, Castleowen, and entrances to the village from the Cork and Tower sides, young and old worked to create installations: plants, seating, and the erection of flagpoles. Local people, restaurants and supermarkets provided food for the hungry workers. A woman named Denise arrived on Friday evening with hundreds of portions of dessert and two buckets of soup; even though she herself, had had to go away for the


weekend. People brought cakes, scones, brown bread, sandwiches. Hundreds of people passed through the doors of the Church of the Resurrection over the two days of the Challenge. It was a wonderful opportunity to make new friends, chatting about the church and its place in the community. For many it was the first time they had visited the church but hopefully it won't be their last. April Gunn entertained the children at the church and chatted with their parents. It was a joyous weekend watching everyone working together for the good of the community.

It was so inspiring, on Sunday morning, to see young people, in the cramped but dry spaces, under the scaffolding, painting away, despite the rain. Meanwhile, there was the strange site of grown men placing their hands against the walls of the church, and some wondered had the wailing wall come to Blarney! Happily, no, it was a case of the painters seeing if the walls were dry enough to paint. Having had such a huge turnout of people of Saturday, there was trepidation about whether anyone would come on Sunday but we needn't have worried, the phenomenal people of Blarney, again took up their spades and paintbrushes to complete the work. Meanwhile the filming continued at the church and in other areas around the village. Griffins, Ravenscourt, and Blarney Garden Centres as well as McCulloughs Nursery were involved in providing fabulous flowers and plants for hanging baskets, window boxes or creating installations. Griffins Garden Centre created an awesome display on the bypass, whilst Ravenscourt made the plaza in front of the church come alive with colour.

The Blarney Vintage committee dressed to impress, arriving to help in a range of costumes with Ed and Deirdre Healy drawing admiring glances and Doug and Olwen Venn parading as Marie Antoinette and Napoleon Bonaparte! Blarney GAA and Camogie clubs were strongly represented during the weekend and the tireless Hugh Finnerty gave generously of his time to act as Health and Safety officer and project manager for the weekend. Kay Dennehy buzzed around all weekend photographing the progress of the various events, amassing more than 1300 photographs!

An abbreviated church service was held at the usual time of 11am on Sunday morning and it was lovely to welcome some of the volunteers to join in the service, we hadn't anticipated the TV cameras joining us but they did. After the service, it was back to work and by late afternoon on Sunday, as the work neared completion, lots of visitors came to investigate the work and have a cuppa. There were so many positive comments about all the projects around the village, that it helped to make all the planning and hard work worthwhile. Blarney, you should all be proud of yourselves.

Many people and companies are owed a huge debt of gratitude for their hard work as well as their financial commitment. The Weekend Challenge was shown on RTE last Wednesday.
