61st Annual Devotions at Lee Road Shrine

On Wednesday, 15th August next, the Feast of the Assumption, the Annual Devotions will take place at the Lee Road Shrine. The general public will assemble near Our Lady's Hospital Gate before 6.30pm and march in procession to the Shrine reciting the 14 Mysteries of the Rosary on the way. Succeeding groups will follow at short intervals. When all have arrived at the Shrine, the fifteenth Mystery will be recited by the entire congregation. For those unable to walk in procession to the Shrine, there will be accommodation available on the south bank of the Lee opposite the shrine.

The Lee Road will be closed to vehicular traffic from the Wellington Bridge to the Shrine from 6.30pm. However, it may be approached by car from the western side up to 7pm. A service of buses will convey people back to the city after the Devotions. Gifts of plants and flowers for the decoration of the Altar and the Shrine will be gratefully received on Wednesday morning at the Shrine.

Mass will be celebrated at the Shrine at 7.30pm by Bishop John Buckley, Bishop of Cork & Ross. Fr. John Fitzgerald MSC PP, Sacred Heart, Western Road, will preach a special sermon at the Shrine.



Times Past...

The Name of St. Ann's Hydro was Known Far and Wide

hournagh meets, at right angles, the River Martin to flow onward to join the Lee near Leemount-Carrigrohane. The two mile stretch between Tower and Blarney is an area adorned with woods which add charm to the western approach of world famous Blarney Castle. On a sloping hillock in the centre of the valley stand the remains of what once was the most famous institution of hydropathy in this part of the world. It was here, over a century ago, that Dr. Richard Barter built a bath that revolutionised the skill of hydropathy (medical treatment by internal and external use of water). An early form of hydropathy was practiced by the Romans died with the Roman Empire and its health giving effects were obscured by the rise of chemistry in the 10th and 11th centuries. But the system was revived in Europe by a Silesian farmer named Vincent Priessnitz of Grafenberg who first tried it out on his farm animals with astounding success.

Long before the name of Grafenberg became associated with Turkish baths, William Penn, founder of the State of Pennsylvania in 1682, learned in his dealings with the Indians that they were aware of the medicinal use of water. Not alone did he see Indian women wash new-born babies in running streams of water, but he also recorded having seen an Indian Chief in the backwoods cured of fever by water treatment peculiar to that tribe. But in this country, the name most closely associated with medicinal baths is that of Dr. Barter who was at one time called the "mad doctor" when he was perfecting his bath at St. Ann's Hill, near Blarney.

Richard Barter was born in Cooldaniel, near Macroom, in the year 1802. The death of his father, which occurred when Richard was a boy, deprived him of his fatherly love and guidance and young Barter grew up with erratic ideas. In his youth he took part in the Whiteboy agitation and, unlike his class of the time, was involved in midnight raids and marching through the country-side. When the time came for him to decide upon a profession he chose medicine and he qualified at the London College of Physicians. Sir Philip Crampton of the college, appreciative of the distinction Dr. Barter won in his examinations, said to him: "You are very young to commence practice; if you should meet an awkward case it might mar your future prospects, therefore I advise you to travel for a year or two."

The young doctor was not in apposition to follow this kindly advice. He was obliged, through circumstances, to go into practice at once. Soon afterwards he was appointed to the dispensary at Inniscarra. There is no dispensary in Inniscarra now, the nearest one being "Dripsey" which is situated six miles from Dripsey at Vicarstown. Through the dispensary at Inniscarra, he built up a splendid private practice among all classes of people. At one stage of his early career, he was endowed with a life annuity of £50 by an old lady who admired his skill at medicine. About that time certain facts which came under his observance induced his to give close attention to hydrotherapeutics. The first was the case of a woman who was brought to him in advanced and fatal stages of cholera. Puzzled by the colour and softness of her skin, the doctor asked the man who brought her along in a cart what she had been doing since she left home? The man replied that she drank water all the way. The woman was removed to hospital where the treatment forbade water and she died. After that Barter treated cholera cases with a new method that contained much drinking water. The success of his new method led him to believe that he had made a discovery in the treatment of the dreaded disease; but despite trips to Dublin and Edinburgh to propound his new discovery, Dr. Barter received little support anywhere. Soon after the cholera epidemic of 1832, Dr. Barter resigned his post at Inniscarra for a new residence near Mallow, where he married a Miss Newman. The marriage must have brought him considerable wealth; because in 1836 he was back in Inniscarra, this time at St. Ann's Hill where he established himself as a landowner and medical man. For a time agriculture claimed him as much as his profession, in fact he showed an eagerness for more land and continued to expand his property at St. Ann's Hill. Incidentally he was instrumental in founding the Agriculture Society and acted as its Secretary for some years. By 1842 a Captain Claridge delivered a number of lectures through-out Ireland on the subject of Hydropathy. One of his lectures in Cork was attended by Dr. Barter who immediately became impressed by this form of treatment. He became aware that the configuration of St. Ann's was ideally suited as a location for a hydro. The southerly aspect of his residence surrounded by comparatively lofty hills to break the force of the wind from any quarter accounted for a salubrious temperature in all seasons of the year. He also understood the place had former connections with faith-healing due to the presence of St. Ann's Well, from which

the hill got its name. The original name of the town-land was Kilnamucky and historians hold that the well in the town-land was not St. Ann's but St. Santan's, the latter being a disciple of St. Finbarr and one of the company at Loch Irce (Gougane Barra?). P. W. Joyce in "Irish Names of Places" states that the St. Ann(e)'s found in Irish place-names are a corruption of Santan.

Originality and independence of mind were expressed in the first vapour bath set up at St. Ann's by Dr. Barter. It was nothing more than a box in which the patient was subjected to vapour heat up to the neck only; the head being outside the box. Subsequently he made a bath after the Russian model that allowed the patient to endure 15 degrees of heat more than in the first bath. When the news of the venture got abroad, St. Ann's Hill was called a 'vapour establishment' by the enemies of vapour baths. A further improvement on the bath announced by Dr. Barter earned him the name of the "Mad Doctor." But a more serious enemy to the early success of Dr. Barter was the Great Famine of 1846-47 which decimated the population and ruined half the gentry, the class of people who, at that time, went in for baths. After the famine he made a fresh start. In 1856 he invited a much-travelled author named David Urquhart to St. Ann's to supervise the erection of a Turkish bath on the lines of the baths Urquhart had seen in the East and had written about in his book. The bath of be-hive shape proved to be a failure because the atmosphere in it was saturated with vapour which the patient inhaled. Barter felt he could correct the failure, so he set about constructing another bath in which he eliminated some of the faults of the earlier one. The result was still far from satisfactory; but Dr. Barter was not to be dissuaded from his ambition, se he sent his nephew, Mr. Richard Barter, to Rome to study plans and details of the Roman thermal and hot air baths. A bath built according to the Roman design was a considerable improvement on the one built by Urquhart in so far as it eliminated vapour, but it proved faulty in the sense that it was heated by means flues underneath the floor which caused burns to patients whose protective footwear (clogs) slipped off while walking across the floor. Barter conceived the idea of putting flues around the walls, thus eliminating floor heat and established himself as the maker of the most successful Turkish bath. Some have gone so far as to credit Barter as the inventor.

St. Ann's Hill Hydro grew in reputation and stature. In 1857 twenty new rooms were added and other enlargements followed from time to time until the place assumed the appearance of a self-contained village. Men such as Sir John Fife, M.D., Sir Erasmus Wilson M.D. Dr. Witt, Dr. Scudamore, Captain Abdy and others having examined and investigated the treatment at St. Ann's, published their views on the merits of the hot air bath. Later the writings of some of the foremost medical men in England on the subject of the powers and efficacy of the bath spread the fame of St. Ann's Hill to Germany, France, America and elsewhere. An exceptional honour was bestowed on Dr. Barter at a public meeting held at St. Ann's Hill on April 22nd 1862 when a large sum of money, publicly subscribed, was presented to him for the purpose of establishing a bath in London. The recipient asked that £200 of the sum subscribed be devoted to a Cork project. By that time St. Ann's Hill had become world famous. People of wealth and position came there to convalesce. To cater for the patients or visitors, the natural amenities of the district, including fishing, hunting and rough shooting were improved; billiards, lawn tennis and musical evenings were introduced and lawns for tennis and croquet were laid out. In fact, the first ninehole golf course in Co. Cork was at St. Ann's. The Hydro and its 200 acre farm was the largest single centre of employment outside the City of Cork for several years. Dr. Barter was one of the most popular and respected men in Ireland. Yet at the height of his glory, he did not overlook the less fortunate; he built a special bath at St. Ann's for the poor of the neighbourhood. Dr. Barter died in October 1870, at the age of 68 years, leaving behind him a monument to his life's labours for humanity. He was succeeded at St. Ann's by a German Named D. Sack. In 1887 the Cork and Muskerry railway was opened to Blarney. One of the stops was at St. Ann's. It is said that Winston Churchill paid a brief visit to St. Ann's accompanied by senior Naval Officers in 1912. But alas the fame of St. Ann's did not last and in recent generations, its story has been one of deterioration and disuse. It is now derelict. But the lisping leaves of tall trees in the romantic surroundings of St. Ann's tell a story that adds a page of glory to the ancient and historic valley of the Shournagh.

Cork City Council plans to reclaim the former city landfill on the Kinsale Road and turn it into the country's largest adventure, leisure and recreation park. Apparently, it will be one of the largest reclamation projects the country has ever seen.

According to the Irish Examiner, the parks events and attractions will include a caravan and motor home rest park for visiting tourists, an all-weather site capable of hosting concerts, ice rinks, circuses, and equestrian events, indoor and outdoor adventure play areas, including zip wires, climbing walls, luge tracks, and zorbing (those big human sized hamster balls), an extreme sports trail and cross-country course, a network of cycle and walking trails, wildlife trails and viewing platforms over wetland areas,urban farming and/or allotments, an area to highlight the use of renewable energies.

It is made from the beans of coffee berries which have been eaten by the Asian Palm Civet (Paradoxurus hermaphroditus) and other related civets, then passed through its digestive tract. A civet eats the berries for their fleshy pulp. In its stomach, proteolytic enzymes seep into the beans, making shorter peptides and more free amino acids. Passing through a civet's intestines the beans are then defecated, keeping their shape. After gathering, thorough washing, sun drying, light roasting and brewing, these beans yield an aromatic coffee with much less bitterness. This coffee is widely noted as the most expensive coffee in the world with prices reaching €200 per pound. (Picture: Tom Doherty)



The Annual Inniscarra Agricultural/Horticultural Show, Old Time Steam Threshing and Vintage Rally will once again take place again at Inniscarra Community Centre, Ballyanly, near Berrings and Cloghroe on Sunday 26th August with a starting time of 1pm.

Firstly outdoors in the sheep ring there five classes available which will also feature a a qualifer for an All-Ireland Scotch Ram Class which will be held at Bantry Show on Sunday 2nd September. In the Sheep section also there is a class for Best Goat. In attendance this year will be members of the popular Ballincollig farmers market who will be displaying and selling pottoes, vegetables, flowers, home baking and organic food and many more items.

associates, and parents of our underage players to contribute 50 towards our 'Sponsor a Slab' campaign.



According to Motivation, restructuring negative thoughts can have a positive effect on weight loss. Be respectful of yourself, avoiding critical behaviour and thoughts. Talk to yourself with dignity, ignoring the negative internal dialogue that can lead to weight-loss discouragement. Instead, replace negative self-talk with positive thoughts. By cultivating a positive mental attitude towards your health, weight and looks, you can achieve some amazing results just by believing that you can. Adopting an "I can" attitude will motivate you to greater things. Believing you can change your look by losing weight brings it about for you because "what you believe you can achieve."

2. Think of your waist not the waste

Don't feel guilty about not eating everything on your plate. Although most children are brought up learning not to waste food, Motivation says it is better to dump extra food into the bin instead of

Murphy calls for review of local bank closures Fine Gael Cork North Central Deputy, Dara Murphy, has written to AIB and Permanent TSB following an announcement by both banks that they are to close their Mayfield branch, calling for the decision to be reviewed.

"Last week, both AIB and PTSB announced branch closures in Mayfield, which is one of the largest suburbs on the northside of Cork city, within 48 hours of each other. While it is unrealistic to think that banks can communicate with each other in advance of such far-reaching announcements, the fact remains that neither Ulster Bank nor Bank of Ireland have a presence in Mayfield and now AIB and PTSB are set to cease operations in the town. "If both of these decisions go ahead, we will arrive at a point where the people of Mayfield will be left without a bank, which is completely unacceptable.

"I have written to both AIB and PTSB informing them of the current situation and calling on both to reconsider their plans for closure. It may be the case that the decision of one of the banks to close its Mayfield branch was a marginal one, which could easily be reversed. From speaking to people on the ground there is definitely a feeling that if either bank was to remain in the area there would be significant goodwill towards that bank.

"If, on the other hand, these decisions are found to be irreversible, an opportunity would exist for either Ulster Bank or Bank of Ireland to open in the area. Despite the fact that much banking is now done online, people still like to go into their branch at certain times. The fact that both AIB and PTSB's main competitor in Mayfield are shutting up shop make little or no sense and I am calling on both banks to look again their plans and to reconsider this decision."


